Goal

- Support people suffering from dementia (as well as their famility members and care givers)
- combat the symptoms of dementia (e.g., loss of identity and self-awareness, feelings of insecurity)
- Continuouity of participation in social life

Proposed Solution

- Provide embodied and playful interactions via physical artifacts and body-based interfaces
- Supporting collaborative interactions between persons with dementia and their loved ones
- Adaptable system to be used at home
